Call to Order, Welcome from the Chair & Public Record Requirements

The LPAC Chair called the meeting to order at **1:34 P.M.** The LPAC Chair welcomed all meeting attendees who were present. Attendees were notified that the LPAC meeting is based on Florida's "Government-in-the-Sunshine Law and meeting reporting requirements, including recording minutes. In addition, it was stated that the acknowledgment of HIV status is not required but is subject to public record if it is disclosed. Introductions were made by the LPAC Chair, Committee members, Recipient staff, PCS & CQM staff, and guests by roll call, and a moment of silence was observed.

#### 1. Public Comment

The Public Comment portion of the meeting is intended to allow the public to express opinions about items on the meeting agenda or to discuss other matters about HIV/AIDS services in Broward County.

There were no public comments.

#### 2. Meeting Approvals

The approval for the agenda of the February 10, 2026 LPAC Ad-Hoc Committee meeting was proposed by **S. Vickers**, seconded by **J. Castillo** and passed unanimously.

**Motion #1: S. Vickers, on behalf of the LPAC Ad-Hoc Committee, made a motion to approve the February 10, 2026, LPAC Ad-Hoc Committee agenda as presented. The motion was seconded by J. Castillo and adopted unanimously.**

S. Isidore read the names of the committee members into the record: B. Mester, P. Eckardt, H. Bahi, K. Creary, J. Rodriguez, J. Castillo, V. Biggs, M. Sension, A. Richardson, J. Deleo, S. Vickers, and J. Shirley.

**Motion #2: S. Vickers, on behalf of the LPAC Ad-Hoc Committee, made a motion to approve the membership of LPAC Ad-Hoc Committee as presented. The motion was seconded by J. Shirley and adopted unanimously.**

7. New Business

- a. **Action Item:** Review the Current Formulary for AIDS Drug Assistance Program  
T. Thompson confirmed the current ADAP formulary is the most up-to-date and said the committee would compare the state ADAP formulary with the Recipient Office's Part A formulary. He reported the average annual cost per client for direct-dispense non-ARVs is \$77.80.

J. Shirley asked whether the formularies provide a safety net. T. Thompson explained that providers can request additions with cost analyses. As ADAP expanded, pharmacy line-item expenditures decreased. M. Rosiere noted that if ARVs like Biktarvy are on the formulary, clients are ineligible for PAPs.

P. Eckardt asked if Part A could fund ARVs no longer covered by ADAP. T. Thompson said ARVs are covered under EFA only in limited, short-term cases. J. Rodriguez explained LPAP was designed for individuals pending ADAP eligibility. Effective March 1, approximately 2,374 individuals previously served by ADAP will require LPAP for non-ARVs. The committee must determine financial impact, as the current formulary is unsustainable.

S. Zayas clarified PAPs are only available if no other coverage exists. J. Wynn emphasized that PAPs are not a long-term solution for large populations, noting over 16,000 affected clients statewide, including 2,500–3,000 in Broward County. Estimated ADAP/LPAP costs in Broward are \$25 million. M. Rosiere estimated that PAP applications for former ADAP clients could total \$6.25 million monthly.

K. Creary referenced a flyer stating FDOH would not change ADAP eligibility; J. Wynn clarified no ruling has been issued. M. Rosiere explained that the legal challenge could delay the March 1 implementation, but preparation is necessary, as proceedings may take up to nine months. She noted that BRHPC cannot continue premium payments (estimated at \$11 million monthly) without reimbursement assurance.

J. Rodriguez stated that the current LPAP SDM only covers marketplace plans supported by ADAP and will require revision. G. James noted that Gilead PAP approvals last one year. A.

DiMauro said AHF uses PAP as primary coverage, EFA as last resort, and medication samples when available. B. Mester raised concerns about rapid entry/test-and-treat clients exhausting annual PAP eligibility. S. Vickers questioned PAP stability for test-and-treat patients.

B. Mester asked whether FDOH ensured at-risk clients receive 90-day supplies. J. Rodriguez answered that the state communicated changes but has not met individually with clients.

T. Thompson suggested creating a separate formulary section for non-ARVs covered for those ineligible for ADAP. Data on commonly prescribed ADAP drugs must come from FDOH. J. Wynn cited the 2023 ADAP utilization report, showing non-ARVs account for ~10% of total costs, with ARVs as the primary cost driver.

G. James and J. Roy said Part A may be able to fund non-ARVs and, if necessary, remove non-life-saving drugs. The Recipient Office can pay copays but not premiums. Manufacturers such as Gilead, ViiV, and Merck have similar PAP eligibility standards.

T. Thompson stated LPAP cost estimates will go to PSRA for reallocation decisions. He will identify drugs on ADAP but not on Part A LPAP. J. Rodriguez recommended physicians review ADAP and propose a new Part A formulary. B. Barnes urged prioritizing mirroring the updated ADAP formulary before adding services and cautioned against overspending in the first fiscal quarter.

J. Rodriguez clarified non-ARV cost estimates were based on the 20 most commonly used drugs at 340B pricing, not retail. M. Rosiere reconciled cost calculations after confusion.

J. Beal warned expanding LPAP could divert funds from other service categories and recommended pharmacists review the ADAP formulary for cost-saving alternatives, including retail discount programs that may undercut 340B pricing.

K. Giglioli stated PSRA will require ARV cost data before decisions are made. J. Wynn agreed to provide available data to PCS staff for committee distribution.

**Motion #3: J. Castillo, on behalf of the LPAC Ad-Hoc Committee, made a motion to remove all antiretroviral medications from the Local Pharmacy Assistance Program formulary. The motion was seconded by K. Creary and adopted unanimously.**

**Motion #4: K. Creary, on behalf of the LPAC Ad-Hoc Committee, made a motion to find the approximate cost of the top 20 the non-ARV drugs on current ADAP formulary for clients above 130% FPL, with an amendment from S. Zayas to include the cost of the ARV for those same clients separately. The motion was seconded by S. Vickers and adopted unanimously.**

- b. **Discussion:** Financial Cost Projection  
The relevant topics were discussed above.
- c. **Discussion:** Review AIDS Pharmacy Assistance Service Delivery Model  
The committee passed over this item.
- d. **Discussion:** Adult and Adolescent Quick-Look Considerations for Biktarvy Switch Options in those with Undetectable HIV Viral Load

J. Beal shared with the committee a peer-reviewed scientific guidance on switching from Biktarvy to alternative effective regimens and developed a resource for practitioners in Broward County. He and D. Cestaro-Seifer reviewed it with multiple practitioners in the system of care. This document is meant to be a sharing point for physicians and pharmacists whose patients will be affected by the ADAP changes. D. Cestaro-Seifer has used this document to develop a

tool for medical case managers to help support providers and address patient anxiety about switching to ADAP formulary alternatives.

S. Vickers expressed concern that access to single-tablet regimens may become restricted. J. Beal clarified that, so far, the State of Florida has communicated that only Biktarvy and Descovy would be subject to restriction.

e. **Discussion:** LPAC Ad-Hoc Committee Future Meeting Dates

B. Mester suggested the committee meet frequently during the ADAP crisis. P. Eckardt questioned what would be discussed at a future meeting and whether the committee would have sufficient information by next week to make an informed decision.

T. Thompson suggested scheduling a tentative meeting for February 17<sup>th</sup> but cancelling or postponing it if the data isn't ready on time. J. Rodriguez confirmed that he could get data on the top 20 drugs, but not the prices for them. The committee decided to wait until the data became available before holding their next meeting.

## Local Pharmacy Advisory Council Committee Formulary Recommendations – May 2026

### Committee Member #1: Von Biggs

#### Medications not included but should be considered for addition:

##### HIV and Infectious Disease

- Bictegravir emtricitabine tenofovir alafenamide as a preferred single tablet regimen for new starts and stable patients transitioning from higher cost regimens
- Doxycycline post exposure prophylaxis indication clarity including standing coverage for STI prevention protocols
- COVID outpatient antivirals such as nirmatrelvir ritonavir if not already covered under emergency mechanisms

##### Aging and Comorbidity Support

- Calcium citrate as an alternative to calcium carbonate for patients on acid suppression therapy
- Alendronate weekly standardized formulation clarity to support osteoporosis management in aging PLWH
- Donepezil and memantine combination coverage for cognitive impairment and HIV associated neurocognitive disorders
- Mirabegron for urinary urgency in patient's intolerant of anticholinergics

##### Behavioral Health and Substance Use

- Long-acting injectable naltrexone expansion clarity for both alcohol use disorder and opioid use disorder overlap
- Extended-release buprenorphine injection for patients with adherence challenges
- Non benzodiazepine sleep agents such as ramelteon to reduce reliance on controlled substances

##### Preventive and Supportive Care

- High dose vitamin D protocols clearly delineated for deficiency treatment vs maintenance
- Iron sucrose injection as an alternative for patient's intolerant of oral iron
- Skin barrier and wound care products standardized to avoid ad hoc non formulary requests



## Committee Member #2: Dr. Paula Eckardt

1. Add Vimpat — seems like the neurologists like to use this for break through seizures on Keppra and I have had Ryan White/ADAP patients prescribed it. The patient was able to get it through a PAP program but not sure how long it will last.

Additionally, not sure if it falls under this category, but continuous glucose monitor option like Dexcom or Freestyle libre to add to covered diabetic supplies.

2. It was my understanding from the last HIVPC and from HIVMA/TIA the state is looking to remove medications off the formulary to hopefully salvage the shortfall from the program? We were recently told they may even remove branded ARVs to accomplish this. If this is still the case then I propose the following:

Remove (can try to obtain through PAP):

## LOCAL PHARMACY ADVISORY COUNCIL COMMITTEE (LPAC)

*Revised and Updated:*

### I. Purpose

The **Local Pharmacy Advisory Committee (LPAC)** to provide recommendations to improve the quality, coordination, and allocation of pharmacy services within the Part A system of care; develop standardized pharmacy processes (including policies, procedures, drug access, formulary changes, and impact analysis); evaluate pharmacy utilization, and eligibility data; coordinate pharmacy services across funding streams (e.g., ADAP, Part B, Medicaid, and private insurance); and review current pharmacologic treatment regimens and federal guidelines.

### II. Policy Statement & Key Activities

The LPAC Committee is responsible for the following:

- A. To make recommendations to the appropriate committees of the HIPVC to improve the quality, effectiveness, and allocation of resources to pharmacy services.
- B. To develop and implement a standardized mechanism for pharmacy services. (i.e. policies and procedures, drug access, formulary changes and impact analysis).
- C. To efficiently collect and evaluate current pharmacy data (i.e., utilization, eligibility) for the impact on the Part A system of care.
- D. To coordinate pharmacy services in collaboration with other funding streams (i.e. ADAP, Part B, Medicaid, private payers, including private insurance providers).

### III. Procedures

1. Data Collection and Review
  - a. Collect pharmacy-related data, including utilization, eligibility, and outcomes, from relevant sources.
  - b. Review and analyze data to identify trends, gaps, and areas for improvement in pharmacy services.
  - c. Use data findings to guide recommendations and inform decision-making.
2. Formulary and Drug Access Review
  - a. Conduct routine reviews of the local AIDS Pharmacy Assistance Program (LPAP) formulary at least quarterly or as needed based on emerging therapies.
  - b. Evaluate requests for:
    - i. Addition of new medications
    - ii. Removal of outdated or ineffective medications
    - iii. Therapeutic substitutions or restrictions
  - c. Assess each formulary change based on:
    - i. Clinical effectiveness and safety
    - ii. Federal HIV treatment guidelines (e.g., DHHS guidelines)
  - d. Maintain documentation of all formulary review decisions and rationale

### IV. Membership

Individuals interested in serving solely as committee members must submit a standing committee application, which requires approval from the LPAC Chair and the HIVPC General Body.

The ideal committee composition shall include, but not be limited to, members with pharmacological and medical expertise and consumer representatives. Desired member qualifications include:

- A. Willingness to collaborate and learn
- B. Basic understanding of data interpretation
- C. Familiarity with quality standards (local/state/federal)
- D. Effective communication skills

Community members are not required to possess all competencies upon joining, but they must be committed to actively learning and engaging with quality management principles and systemic analysis.

# HIV HEALTH SERVICES PLANNING COUNCIL MEETING GROUND RULES

1. The Council, its members, and the public recognize and respect the committee process adopted by this Council. The Council, its members, and the public recognize that full discussion and analysis of issues occurs at the committee level rather than at Council meetings.
2. Before a member can make a motion or speak in debate, the member must be recognized by the Chair as having the exclusive right to be heard at that time.
3. All speakers are expected to address the Council in a respectful manner to respect time limits, to speak briefly and to the point, and to stay on agenda. All other persons in attendance should not interrupt the speaker who is recognized by the Chair as having the floor.
4. If the member who made the motion claims the floor and has not already spoken on the question, that member is entitled to be recognized in preference to other members.
5. No person is entitled to the floor a second time in debate on the same item as long as any other person who desires the floor has not spoken on the item.
6. Speakers should restrict comments and debate to the pending question or motion. Speakers must address their remarks to the Chair and maintain a courteous tone. The Chair may impose time limits on debate or discussion to ensure efficient conduct of Council business.
7. Members should not name service providers and/or persons during any discussion unless the service provider or person is identified in the subject of the motion or agenda item. Specific concerns regarding service providers should be directed towards the Grantee, outside of the meeting.
8. Members of the public may only address the Council upon recognition by the Chair. They are subject to the same rules of conduct expected of Council members.
9. No alcohol or drug use (unless prescribed by a licensed physician), is permitted at Council meetings, grantee or support staff offices.
10. No abusive language, threats of violence, or possession of weapons are permitted in Council meetings, grantee or staff offices.
11. Repeated violation of these meeting rules may result in no further recognition of the offending member or attendee by the Chair at that meeting. Any serious breach of conduct which disrupts the Council's meeting may subject the offender to removal from the meeting, administrative or legal process.



# CONSEJO DE PLANEACIÓN DE SERVICIOS DE SALUD VIH

## REGLAS BÁSICAS DE LA REUNIÓN

1. Los miembros deberán aceptar y respetar el proceso de comité adoptado por este Consejo. Las discusiones y el análisis en pleno de los temas tendrán lugar a nivel de comité y no en las reuniones plenarias del Consejo.
2. Antes de que un miembro pueda iniciar una moción o de que una persona pueda hablar en un debate, el Presidente de la reunión deberá reconocer que él o ella tienen el derecho exclusivo de hablar en ese momento dado.
3. Se espera que todos los ponentes se dirijan al Consejo de una manera respetuosa, que no se interrumpa al ponente con derecho al habla en el momento, que cuando se hable se haga de forma clara y concisa, y que se mantenga la agenda.
4. Si el miembro que inicia una moción no ha hablado todavía y reclama su derecho a hablar sobre un asunto, él/ella tendrán el derecho a que con preferencia se les reconozca.
5. Nadie tendrá derecho a reclamar el habla por una segunda vez, en un debate sobre el mismo tema, cuando otra persona que no ha hablado todavía, desea hacerlo.
6. Los debates deben ceñirse a los asuntos o mociones que estén pendientes. Al hablar, los ponentes deben referirse al Presidente, y mantener un tono cortés.
7. Los miembros del público solo podrán dirigirse al Consejo cuando hayan sido reconocidos por el Presidente de la reunión. Estarán sujetos a las mismas reglas de conducta que se esperan de los miembros del Consejo. Se establecerán límites de tiempo según sea necesario para garantizar que los asuntos del Consejo cursen de manera eficiente.
8. Miembros del público sólo podrán dirigir el Consejo a partir del reconocimiento por el Presidente. Están sujetos a las mismas reglas de conducta que se espera de los miembros del Consejo.
9. No estará permitido el uso de bebidas alcohólicas o de drogas en las reuniones del Consejo y tampoco en las oficinas del personal de soporte y donatarios.
10. No está permitido el uso de lenguaje abusivo, amenazas de violencia y posesión de armas en las reuniones del Consejo ni en las oficinas del personal de soporte y donatarios.
11. La repetida violación de estas reglas básicas dará como resultado que el Presidente de la reunión deje de reconocer al derecho a participación del ofensor o miembro de la audiencia. Cualquier violación de conducta grave, que perturbe la reunión de Consejo, terminará en la remoción del ofensor, de la reunión.
